

Distress Paints Without Stress

Choose your art journal surface. Class demonstration - Strathmore Mixed-Media 300 series journal - size 5.5" x 8.5" - 90 lb, paper.

Supplies Demonstrated:

- Journal
- Art Quest Perfect Paper Adhesive Matte
- Scotch Quick-dry Adhesive
- Wood Icing or Light Molding Paste
- Palette Knife
- Gesso and brush
- Distress Paints Picket Fence, Black Soot, Rusty Hinge, Mustard Seed, Broken China, Peeled Paint and Bundled Sage
- Faber-Castell Pitt Pen Black, size S
- Sakura Gelly Roll Pen Black
- Paper Napkin with several of same or similar images (example roses)
- Scissors for paper
- Text Paper
- Ranger Craft Scrubbie
- Nonstick Craft Mat
- Water
- Heat gun Heat-it Craft Tool
- Paper Towels
- Office supply date stamp

Process:

1. The demonstration covers 2 pages.



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- 2. With palette knife, smear a random, very light coat of Wood Icing or Light Molding Paste over the pages. Don't cover the entire surface as this is to create texture on the page.
- 3. Dry the texture medium with heat gun.
- 4. Gesso pages and dry them well. (Gesso is a primer that seals the paper and adds body or structure to the paper, too.)
- 5. Prepare the Distress paints by shaking them. You should hear the little mixing ball mixing the paint.
- 6. Randomly apply the following colors: Mustard Seed, Broken China, Bundled Sage and Rusty Hinge. With a damp brush, blend the edges of the paints colors.
- 7. While the paint is still somewhat damp, sprinkle water over the damp paints.
- 8. Allow the paint to sit for 30 60 seconds. Blot the water spots with a paper towel to lift off the paint. Dry well.
- 9. Cut out the rose images from paper napkin. When preparing to apply the images, you need only the very top layer of napkin.
- 10. Apply Perfect Paper Adhesive to journal page. Lay the napkin image in the wet PPA, smooth out with a brush dipped in PPA. Be sure to coat the entire image with PPA. This glue is wonderful for napkins and eliminates wrinkling and tearing of the delicate napkin. Dry well.
- 11. Paint a couple of sheets of text paper with Distress Paints Bundled Sage and Peeled Paint. Blend colors slightly. Dry well.
- 12. Cut strips of the green text paper for stems. Glue to pages with Scotch Quick-dry Adhesive.
- 13. Cut leaves from the same stem paper. Be sure to vary the sizes. Glue the leaves to the stems as you like with Scotch Quick-dry Adhesive.
- 14. Create some clouds in the sky with Picket Fence Distress paint. Let it dry a bit and then add a little shading with a gray created with Broken China, Picket Fence and a **tiny** bit of Black Soot Distress Paints.
- 15. Make sure that everything is very dry.



- 16. Using the black Gelly Roll pen, loosely outline the leaves, stems, and roses. The Gelly Roll pen dries a bit slower than some pens, so if you are right-handed, begin on the left edge of the journal. If you are left-handed, begin on the right edge of the journal.
- 17. Add birds with black Gelly Roll pen.
- 18. Add your words in black Pitt pen.
- 19. Edge the pages with Black Soot Distress paint.
- 20. Date your page.
